In 1657, the owner named himself "Jinkoya Sakubei" and specialized in selling Japanese incense and incense sticks. "Jinkoya"(Aloes wood trader) was a name peculiar to Sakai, they authorized only medicinal wholesalers who specialized in incense to use the name. Jinkoya Sakubei named his shop "Jinsaku" by abbreviating his name. We at Baieido continue to protect the secret formulas of our ancestral forefather Jinkoya Sakubei. It is the ardent desire of Baieido to provide the true sacred aromas of only the purest high quality incense to our customers through the methods treasured since our establishment in the year 1657.

#### Shu Koh Koku

Shukohkoku literally means Gathering of Incense Nations. This of course is a reference to the Silk Road which was forged to trade silk from China to the West. The Silk Road became the vehicle of Buddhist missionaries and the means of introducing Buddhism into China. It was these Buddhist monks that introduced incense into China, and with it created another commodity to be traded along the route -- incense ingredients.
