Zen masters and artists have been drawing their Ensei's (meaning "Zen Circle") for centuries.

So what does Ensei represent? That can only be answered through our own reflection.

Each Ensei incense reflects the time of day: Cinnamon and Clove in the morning, Sandalwood in the afternoon, and the serenity of fine Jinko (aloeswood) in the evening.

Whether you are beginning your day or unwinding at night, you will find Ensei to be a wonderful aid in your reflection.



Kobunboku is an expression of the Plum Tree.






Jinkou Kobunboku – Less Smoke

Jinko Kobunboku combines modern methods of virtually eliminating smoke with traditional ingredients like sandalwood, aloeswood(jinko), cassia and borneol.

This is excellent incense for all times of day, having a very soft but pleasing aroma.

Shu Koh Koku

Syukohkoku literally means Gathering of Incense Nations. This of course is a reference to the Silk Road which was forged to trade silk from China to the West. The Silk Road became the vehicle of Buddhist missionaries and the means of introducing Buddhism into China. It was these Buddhist monks that introduced incense into China, and with it created another commodity to be traded along the route -- incense ingredients.





Baieido dates back to the Muromachi(1338-1573) period when the founder, Kakuuemon Yamatoya, became a medicinal wholesaler of Japanese style incense in Sakai City, Japan. In 1657, the owner named himself "Jinkoya Sakubei" and specialized in selling Japanese incense and incense sticks. "Jinkoya"(Aloes wood trader) was a name peculiar to Sakai, they authorized only medicinal wholesalers who specialized in incense to use the name. Jinkoya Sakubei named his shop "Jinsaku" by abbreviating his name. We at Baieido continue to protect the secret formulas of our ancestral forefather Jinkoya Sakubei. It is the ardent desire of Baieido to provide the true sacred aromas of only the purest high quality incense to our customers through the methods treasured since our establishment in the year 1657.
